<u>History</u>

We will be learning....

Chronology- The Tudors reigned between 1485 and 1603

Cultural- Tudors had to pay tax on the ground space the houses took up and windows.

Military and Political- The War of the Roses was a war between the House of York (King Richard III) and the House of Lancaster (Henry Tudor VII). Henry won and this began the Tudor period.

Economic- The Tudors introduced the royal mint to make coins. They always had a picture of the ruling monarch on them.

Religion, Beliefs & Values (Christmas)

We will be learning about the arrival of Jesus as God's Son, the miracles he performed, how he helped people and offered forgiveness of sins. Additionally, we will learning what is meant by the term 'incarnation.'

Science

Light

The children will learn that light travels in a straight line. And that reflection is when light bounces off a surface this changes the direction in which the light travels.

Whilst studying light the children will learn that refraction is when light travels from air through water or glass and bends because light travels in straight lines, when there is an opaque object blocking the light, a shadow is formed. These shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them. The children will also learn that depending on the light source and distance from the object the shadow will be larger or smaller.
