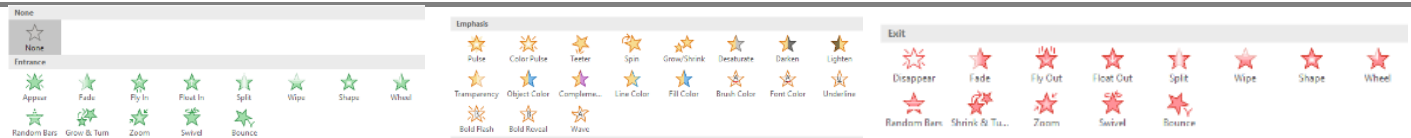

Lesson outline

Lesson 1 Research Tutankhamun

LO- To open a powerpoint and add text

Sticky Knowledge-

To open PowerPoint

Research Tutankhamun (focus for their power point)

Copy and paste and image onto a power point using skills from year 3 word topic.

Familiarise the children with power point- how is it similar to word?

Children to practice typing on PowerPoint using their Tutankhamun research.

Lesson 2 What are animations?

LO- To use animations for entry and exit

Sticky Knowledge-

Animations control the pace of the presentation.

Animations enhance the appearance and interest of the slides.

Discuss what is PowerPoint, why it is used?

Children to explore how to use power point.

Introduce animations, what they are and how they change a power point.

Children to animate, emphasize and move a picture. Have a sentence enter and another exit. Children to experiment.

Lesson 3 Recording sound

LO- To identify that sound can be recorded

Sticky Knowledge-

I can identify the input and output devices used to record and play sound

I can use a computer to record audio

Teach Computing lesson 1- Recording audio

In this lesson, learners will identify the input devices used to record sound and output devices needed to listen to it. They will then record their voices using a computer, and reflect on what makes a good audio recording. Lastly, learners will consider ownership and copyright issues related to recordings.

Lesson 4 Editing audio

LO- To explain that audio recordings can be edited

Sticky Knowledge-

I can re-record my voice to improve my recording

Teach Computing lesson 2- editing audio

In this lesson, learners will record and re-record their voices to improve their recordings. They will edit the recordings, removing long pauses and mistakes.

Children will record their voices to read out the sentences from their powerpoints. They will then edit these sentences by using the trimming tool.
