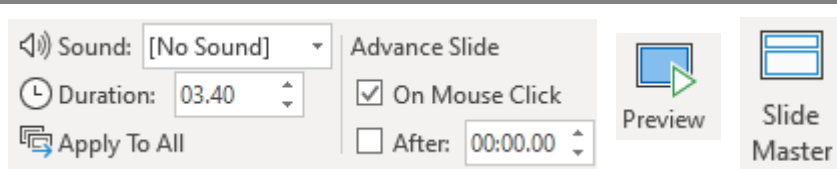
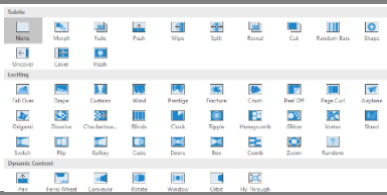

Lesson 1- Recap animations

LO- To use animations

SK- Year 4

Animations enhance the appearance and interest of the slides

Log onto Teams and open a new PowerPoint file.

Explain what animations are, why we add them to PowerPoints. Model how to add, remove different pictures and text.

Recap the use of adding audio to a PowerPoint. Children are to voice record sound clips reading out information/ facts about Henry VIII.

Children to work in pairs to create a PowerPoint based on Henry VIII facts. 5 slides. Each slide is to include a range of animations being used and at least 1 sound clip.

Log onto Teams and open previous PowerPoint on Henry VIII

Model to children how to insert videos and audios to PowerPoints.

Children to add a video and an audio file to their PowerPoint **Make sure you have a video downloaded on the system for the children to upload or this lesson will not work.**

Children to present their work to the rest of the class.

<p>Lesson 3 & Lesson 4- Introduction to transitions</p> <p>LO- To use transitions between slides SK- Transitions control the speed, add sound and customize effects.</p>		<p>Log onto Teams and open a new file – PowerPoint – Save as names + transitions, Introduce children to transitions. Model to children how to add transitions and explain what they do. How to add sounds for each transition and control the speed. Children to work in pairs to create a PowerPoint with 7 slides – A picture and a fact about Henry VIII and his 6 wives. Add animations to the pictures and text on each slide. Experiment with a range of transitions, adding sound for each transition and controlling the speed. Children to watch their own PowerPoint as a presentation to assess the animations / transitions they have used.</p>																									
<p>Lesson 5- Customizing effects</p> <p>LO- - To use transitions between slides SK- Transitions control the speed, add sound and customize effects.</p>		<p>Log onto Teams and open up Tudors PowerPoint Use child's work as an example – Share PowerPoint with the class and evaluate it. Explain to children how things can be adapted to make improvements and model how to customize the effects they have added to their PowerPoints. Children to pair up with another pair and watch each other's presentations. Evaluate and give feedback to each other. Adapt any transitions needed and customize the effects they have added. Ensure PowerPoints are completed ready for presenting and assessment the following week.</p>
