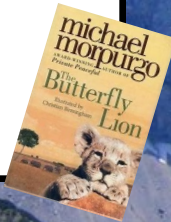

Human fact- Some tribes live in these mountains and have adapted their lives in many ways in order to survive here.

Location fact- The rocks between the Pacific bed and the old lands were squeezed and forced into a towering mountain system called: The Andes.

Statistical fact- The Andes is the world's longest mountain range, forming a continuous chain of highland along the western coast of South America. It is over 7,000 km (4,400 miles) long, 500 km (300 miles) wide in some parts and of an average height of about 4,000 m.

Physical fact- Highest Mountain: Aconcagua in Argentina. The mountain (6,961metres/22,837ft) is located in the Andes mountain range.

Science - Forces

In Science we will be learning about Forces...

Forces are pushes and pulls. These forces change the motion and direction of an object.

Forces make an object or thing to start to move or speed up, slow it down or even make it stop.

Forces act in opposite directions to each other.

When an object moves across a surface, friction acts as an opposite force. Friction is a force that holds back the motion of an object.
