History

Chronology- Anglo Saxons, Picts and Scots invaded from AD400. The era ended in 1066 when the Normans conquered Britain.

The Vikings invaded in AD793. They came from Norway, Sweden and Denmark

Cultural- The Anglo Saxons didn't like the stone houses and roads from the Romans so they built their own villages and went back to making houses from wattle and daub.

Vikings lived in longhouses and were skilled craftsmen

Social- Vikings brought ship building to Britain

Some of our words today come from Viking and Anglo-Saxon

Military and Political- Britain was divided into small kingdoms ruled by different Anglo-Saxon kings.

Vikings raided and settled in England

Economic- The Vikings were great explorers and travellers. They traded in silk, silver, spices and many other things

Science -Materials

Materials which are good thermal conductors allow heat to move through them easily.

Thermal conductors are used to make items that require heat to travel through them easily, such as a saucepan which requires heat to travel through to cook food.

Thermal insulators do not let heat travel through them easily. Examples of thermal insulators include woollen clothes and flasks for hot drinks.

When the particles of a solid mix with the particles of a liquid, this is called dissolving. The result is a solution. Materials that dissolve are soluble.

Materials that do not dissolve are insoluble.
