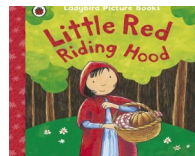

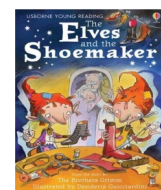

Science - Materials and their uses

Materials are used for different purposes based on their properties.

Wood is used to make furniture because it is a hard and a strong material.

Metal can be used to make coins, cans, cars and cutlery.

Glass is used to make windows because it is transparent.

Some objects can be made from a range of different materials for example a spoon could be made from metal or plastic.

Some materials are not suitable due to their properties, for example paper would not make a good window.

The shape of some materials can be changed when they are stretched, twisted, bent and squashed.
