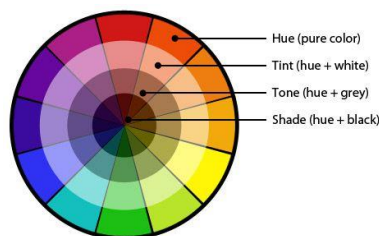

Lesson 1: Investigate

LO: To evaluate the work of Banksy and compare to propaganda posters

Sticky Knowledge:

Banksy is an anonymous graffiti artist.
 Banksy's famous works include Balloon Girl and Love is in the Bin
 Banksy's style is described as street art, graffiti and printing

What is Propaganda? Show children examples of propaganda posters. As a class discuss what can be seen- this will create a design criteria (slogans, fronts, colour choices and purpose)
 Propaganda- Information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote a political cause or view point.
 Who is Banksy? [Banksy: Who is Banksy? What we know about the anonymous graffiti artist - CBBC Newsround](#)
 Show the children examples of his work.
 Compare Banksy with propaganda posters of WW1 and 2. similarities and differences

<p>Lesson 2: Focus practical tasks</p> <p>LO: To know how to use a variety of collage techniques</p> <p>Art Skills: Use different techniques, colours and textures in collage work</p>	<p>Collage techniques- cutting, tearing, overlapping, scrunching etc Use fabrics, different papers and other materials to collage with.</p> <p>Experiment using drawing materials over the top of collage e.g. pens, felt tips, pencils, oil pastels</p> <p>Reflect on the effects</p> <p>Allow the children to explore the range of materials and techniques (which can be easily printed onto but also hits the design brief?)</p>	
<p>Lesson 3: Focus practical tasks</p> <p>LO: To know how to print onto different surfaces and describe the effect</p> <p>Art Skills: Confidently print onto paper and fabric</p> <p>Layer prints confidently</p>	<p>Making prints- recap printing techniques taught in Year 4 and 5, including layering prints</p> <p>Print on varied materials.(card, cardboard, hessian, cotton, and canvas)</p> <p>Reflect on the effects</p> <p>Photos to be taken of the process</p>	
<p>Lesson 4: Planning</p> <p>LO: Plan a final collage based on propaganda posters</p> <p>Art Skills: Carry out preliminary studies, test media and materials</p>	<p>Try out some ideas for their own poster inc slogans, images and arrange to create a mood board.</p> <p>Children decide which font, WW2 slogan and lettering they will use.</p>	
<p>Lesson 5: Final piece</p> <p>LO: To create a collage inspired by propaganda posters</p> <p>Art Skills: Use a range of collage techniques</p> <p>Use a range of printing techniques</p>	<p>Create final piece</p> <p>Explain the success criteria so children are clear on expected outcome (to create a propaganda poster in the style of Banksy)</p> <p>Photos taken of the process of making the art.</p>	
<p>Lesson 6: Final Piece and Evaluation</p> <p>LO: To evaluate their poster</p> <p>Art Skills: Compare ideas, methods and approaches in their own and others' work and say what they think and feel about them</p>	<p>Allow children time to reflect on their own posters. Critically analyse what has gone well in terms of techniques and materials used.</p> <p>As a class talk about each other's referring to the criteria.</p> <p>Photos to be taken</p>
