Grammar Bank

Colours are words that describe objects. We call them "**adjectives**". Watch out in French every time we meet the colours as the spelling might change to match the object the colour describes.

When you ask a question in French you can turn a sentence into a question **by raising the pitch of your voice at the end of the question.** e.g. Ça va? Ça va.

<p>Lesson 1- I can say and write a greeting and a farewell in French,</p> <p><i>'I can say and write a greeting and a farewell in French.'</i></p>	<p>Let's explore some places in France. Look at the pictures, the map and discuss as a class. Has anyone been to France before?</p> <p>Listen to and repeat the greetings and farewells. Add actions to help you remember the phrases.</p> <p>Pass a ball around the class. Say a greeting or farewell when you hold the ball. Don't repeat the same as the person before you.</p> <p>Create French bunting. Choose a greeting or farewell to ass to your bunting, then decorate with the colours of the French flag.</p>
<p>Lesson 2- I can ask and answer a question n "How are you?" in French.</p> <p><i>'I can ask and answer the question "How are you?" in French.'</i></p>	<p>Listen to and join in with the greetings song.</p> <p>Use the PowerPoint to learn how to ask and answer the question 'How are you?' in the target language</p> <p>Play a game of Simon says with the actions we've learnt to the question "How are you?".</p> <p>Have enough worksheets printed for each child. Read the feelings phrases and draw the face to match the sentence.</p>
<p>Lesson 3- I can say "My name is..." and ask "What is your name?" in French.</p> <p><i>'I can say "My name is..." and ask "what is your name?" in French.'</i></p>	<p>Listen to and join in with the greetings song.</p> <p>Listen to and learn how to say 'What is your name?' and 'My name is...' Practise with a partner using different voices and volumes.</p> <p>Game Play a detective game, find the French person in the class. Follow the instructions on the game resource.</p> <p>Read the message aloud. Translate what the alien is saying into English. The children can write a similar message about themselves.</p>
<p>Lesson 4- I can say numbers between 0 and 1</p> <p><i>'I can say some numbers between 0 and 10.'</i></p>	<p>Choose from the two options: Sing the greetings song. Ask three classmates how they are feeling today.</p> <p>Listen to numbers 1-10. Practise counting on fingers. Then try independently.</p> <p>Play the games to practise numbers. Stand up sit down and how many rockets. Follow the instructions in the game resource.</p> <p>Have enough worksheets printed. Read the numbers and draw the correct number of rockets.</p>
<p>Lesson 5- I can remember and write some numbers between 0 and 1.</p>	<p>Complete the number memory challenge.</p> <p>Re-visit numbers by playing the quizlet game. Air write five numbers.</p>

<p><i>'I can remember and write some numbers between 0 and 10'.</i></p>	<p>Play Magic pen writing. Trace the number word with your finger on the table or your partners back. Then can they guess which number you are writing. Rocket Maths Problem Sheet: Work out the maths question and write the number word in French.</p>	
<p>Lesson 6- I can say some colours in French. <i>'I can say some colours in French'.</i></p>	<p>Memory game: Play this number memory game. Using the PowerPoint, listen to and repeat colours. Add an action to help remember the colours. Play a game of "Simon says" with the actions for each colour. With a partner, write a song to a familiar tune using some of the colour words.</p>
