Noun Bank: Rooms in the house

une maison- a house
une chambre- a bedroom
une cuisine – the kitchen
une salle de bains- a bathroom
une salle à manger- a dining room
un salon- a lounge
un jardin- a garden

Grammar

In French, when we use 'la' or 'le', we're referring to something specific.
 For example, '**la cuisine**' means 'the kitchen' (we know *exactly* which one we're talking about).

When we want to talk about something nonspecific, we use 'une' or 'un'. For instance, '**une cuisine**' means 'a kitchen' (it could be *any* kitchen).

To switch between 'une/un' and 'le/la', follow this rule:

- Change 'une' to 'la'.
- Change 'un' to 'le'.

vieux/vieille – old
lumineux/ lumineuse – bright
utile - useful
moderne – modern
confortable - comfortable

une fenêtre – a window
un lit – a bed
un tapis – a rug

Some adjectives change the spelling to match the noun:
 La cuisine est **petite**.
 La chambre est **moderne**.
 Le salon est **beau**.
 Le lit est **confortable**.
