Use the verb “jouer” (to play) to talk about ball sports.

For all the other sports you can use the verb “faire” (to do) with the phrase “je fais” (“I do”).

For example:
Je joue au tennis – I play tennis
Je joue au foot – I play football
Je fais du cyclisme – I do cycling
Je fais de la gymnastique – I do gymnastics

Title/Focus	Lesson outline
Lesson 1- I can understand and remember some sports nouns in French. <i>'I can understand and remember some sports nouns in French.'</i>	Get up and join in the warm up video. Watch a few times adding speed. Sports nouns: Practise and learn 10 sports nouns. Display pictures and words, can you match up the pictures to the words. Next slide only pics, can you remember the words. Sports centre challenge Play in teams. Guess the sport being played in the sports centre, as a team say the sport in French and choose one person to spell it correctly. Make a “favourites list”. Use a bilingual dictionary to look up for new sports.
Lesson 2- I can talk about sports I like and dislike. <i>I can talk about sports I like and dislike.</i>	Penalty shoot out game. New sports added to those already practised. “ teams .Each team has a goal keeper for each round .Goalkeeper must try to pick (and save) the vocabulary that he/she thinks matches the audio. A recap how to talk about your likes and dislikes using texts that describe the likes and dislikes of the person. Listen to the audio. Read the texts. Explore the information. Check answers. The “I like, I don't like, I love” sports game Sentence sprint Work as teams/tables to write sentences about sports, by passing a piece of paper around, with each team member adding a new sentence. The first team to finish writing their sentences wins.
