Sports nouns: Practise and learn 10 sports nouns. Display pictures and words, can you match up the pictures to the words. Next slide only pics, can you remember the words. Sports centre challenge Play in teams. Guess the sport being played in the sports centre, as a team say the sport in French and choose one person to spell it correctly. Make a "favourites list". Use a bilingual dictionary to look up for new sports.
