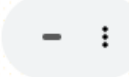

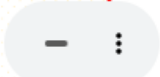

<p>Lesson 1- I can learn about French traditions and take part in a carnival celebration <i>'I can learn about French traditions and take part in a carnival celebration'</i></p>	<p>Which animal is it? Listen to the audio and identify the animal based on its colour. Learn about Carnival in France. Quiz Quiz Swap Run off the cards , one per child for the game. Introduce your animal to a friend by saying "Je suis..." (I am...), then swap your card and introduce your new animal to someone else. Create your own carnival animal mask. Choose an animal mask template, colour it in, and cut it out, to create your own carnival mask.</p>
<p>Lesson 2- I can say and write some numbers between 1 and 16. <i>'I can say and write some numbers between 1 and 16'</i></p>	<p>Number 1 to 10 recall. Complete the four mini activities to help you remember the numbers from 1 to 10 in French. Introduce, practise and learn and practise numbers 11 to 16 in French. Pancake Problems Investigate and solve some "pancakes" maths problems. Reinforce learning of new numbers 11-16. Pancakes multiplications problems Look at the maths problem and then write the correct number of pancakes in French.</p>
<p>Lesson 3- I can say and write some numbers up to 20. <i>'I can say and write some numbers up to 20'</i></p>	<p>"I have/ who has?" Practise asking and answering a question using parts of the verb "to have". Each player receives a card with a statement e.g. "I have [number], who has [another number]?" Players take turns to read aloud their cards, until all cards are matched up. Learn and practise numbers 16 to 20 in French. Stand up bingo Each player chooses a number between 11 and 20. Using the online game online game, open boxes to reveal numbers. If a box shows your chosen number, you sit down. Continue until all boxes are opened, and the last player/s standing are the winners. Crossword Fill in the crossword puzzle, using numbers from 11 to 20 in French.</p>
