On the cloth have a series of foods that would have been shared at Passover (or pictures of them — see Resources for details). Have some real unleavened bread and red grape juice. (Idea adapted from Understanding Christianity.)				
		Explore the link between the Jewish festival of Passover and the Last Supper. Explain how Passover is celebrated today and the significance of each item on the Seder plate.
