Lesson Outline:			
Sticky Knowledge: Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. Some Christians such as Catholics will go to church and have an ash cross made on their head. It helps them to remember Jesus' ultimate sacrifice dying on the cross and his resurrection.  Discuss Ash Wednesday – it is the first day of Lent. The name from the traditional blessing of the ashes taken after Palm branches (or crosses made from Palm leaves) from year's Palm Sunday celebrations. In some churches, such Catholic church, the ashes are used to draw a cross on the people to mark the beginning of their Lent fast.
