Lesson 3	LO: To know who Amy Johnson was and why she is important.	Enquiry question – Why was Amy Johnson such an inspiration? Who was Amy Johnson? Learn about her life and achievements. Explain that Amy Johnson was born in Hull and was the first person to fly solo to Australia in 1930. Amy Johnson is an inspiration to women because it was unusual for women at the time to fly planes.
	Sticky Knowledge: Amy Johnson was born in Hull and was the first person to fly solo to Australia in 1930.	Create a timeline of 6 key events in Amy Johnson's life including: when she was born, her education, her first flying lesson, flight to Australia, flight to New York and her death. ARE – Plot 6 events on timeline. Structure of timeline provided to support layout. Write a sentence about each event. WTS – Plot 6 events on timeline. Structure of timeline provided to support layout. Write short phrases for each event (e.g. Born in Hull) GDS – Sequence and plot 6 key dates and pictures on a timeline. Line provided but pupils structure the layout themselves. Write a short sentence about each event, including key details.
Lesson 4	LO: To know who Amy Johnson was and why she is important.	Enquiry question: Why is Amy Johnson famous? Visit- Children to visit the street life museum and take part in an Amy Johnson workshop.
	Sticky Knowledge:	Children to learn who Amy Johnson was and why she became famous through a series of interactive challenges. Discover how Amy prepared for her famous flight to Australia, what her record-breaking attempt was like and what dangers she faced along the way. The led session includes:
	Amy Johnson was born in Hull and was the first person to fly solo to Australia in 1930.	 Introduction to the site and setting the scene about the session. Object handling linked to aspects of Amy's early life. Meet Amy (character-led aspect) and discover how she prepared for her famous flight to Australia by helping to pack her emergency kit. Learn about her experiences of flying to Australia using original source material. Plenary and evaluation.
Lesson 5	LO: To know where Amy Johnson flew to and the problems she faced Sticky Knowledge: Amy Johnson flew from England to Australia.	Enquiry question- What problems did Amy Johnson face on her flight from England to Australia? Recap where Amy Johnson flew to. Showing a world map with journey plotted out, discuss the distance from London to Darwin. Highlight that the journey took 19 days and that she had to stop off in multiple countries along the way. Discuss what her journey would have been like? Show pictures of her plane etc. What challenges might she have faced? Listen to audio clips of Amy's diary entries: (https://www.bbc.co.uk/sounds/play/p08cdy5z) Group work- Children rotate and look at clues to figure out what problems she faced. Children to use A3 sheets of paper to record. (Pictures in books/twitter).
